Dear Resident/Occupier,

**Re: Proposed Parking/Loading Restrictions & 20mph Speed Limit (Graven Hill)**

Following an earlier consultation carried out in May 2018 regarding various proposals linked to the Graven Hill development in Bicester/Ambrosden, Oxfordshire County Council is now re-consulting on the proposals due to the expiration of the statutory 2-year period in which to implement the original proposals.

The proposals which are being put forward as part of the development of the site remain as originally consulted on, and comprise of the following measures: 1) a 20mph speed limit on all roads within the development, 2) a 'Prohibition of waiting and loading/unloading at any time' on the Circular Road East, Graven Hill Road and Westcott Road (i.e. the inner circulatory route), and 3) providing One Hour parking restrictions on all days (no return within 1 hour) on the 20 designated parking bays fronting the retail premises on Graven Hill Road.

(SPEED LIMITS) ORDER 20\*\***

NOTICE HEREBY GIVEN that Oxfordshire County Council proposes to make the above orders under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers. The effect of the orders is to introduce parking and loading restrictions, and speed limits in the Graven Hill residential development area as follows:

1. Prohibition of waiting and loading/unloading at any time to be introduced on: Austin Way, Anniversary Avenue West, East Circular Road, Graven Hill Road, Roberts Road, and Westcott Road to be kept free for moving traffic only (except for Buses stopping),
2. One Hour Waiting on all days (no return within 1 hour) – 20 parking bays fronting the retail premises on the northwest side of Graven Hill Road,
3. The whole development area south of the A41 roundabout will be subject of 20mph speed limit.

\* This is a repeat of the same consultations which was carried out in 2018 but has since 'timed out' after 2 years due to development delays.

The Oxfordshire County Council (Bicester) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1992 will be further amended accordingly, and the Oxfordshire County Council (Ambrosden, Arncott, Blackthorn, Merton and Piddington Parishes) (Speed Limits) Order 2020 will be revoked/replaced.
